FINANCE: Unaudited results for the first ten-month period ending October 31,2006 reflected net sales of \$9,970,800, contributions of \$4,854,500 and total revenue of \$10,836,100. Unaudited net profit for the ten months of \$599,225 compares with \$509,164 budgeted profit and is \$398,900 less than the \$998,000 profit reported for the same period in 2005.

GRAPEVINE/LaVINA: The sales of the Grapevine have been dropping in the last few months, resulting in a loss of \$104,253 in the first nine months of 2006.

The price of a subscription to the LaVina per year has gone up to \$9.00,

The single issue has been raised to \$2.00, effective January 1,2007. The LaVina also had a loss of \$57,400 the first nine months of 2006.

DELEGATE PAST & PRESENT CONFERENCE: The Conference will be held February 9-11,2007 in Independence, Ohio. Anyone may go, I personally have been attending for the past four or five years. I find them very educational and informative with all the experience, strength and hope present in the rooms.
